General Comments							
A Monitoring Inspection occurred on April 15, 2025.							
Children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor free play, as well as during snack time. Proper handwashing practices were noted during transitions. Steps or platforms were available to support children in independently accessing regular-sized toilets and sinks.							
Educators shared that the children are currently interested in planting flowers for Mother's Day gifts, signing in their names on a name board, painting at the art easel, and welcoming guests such as dental hygienists to learn about oral hygiene. They also expressed that children are enjoying outdoor activities and engaging with the seasonal changes. Educators were observed using positive language, offering gentle reminders, and responding to children in supportive and respectful ways.							
The daily incident log is maintained and reportable incidents are appropriately documented with completed incident report forms and parent communication. Outdoor play is offered for at least one hour in each four-hour block when the majority of children are present, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and the records are posted. Required documents such as the facility license, inspection reports.							

The facility provides snacks at intervals of three hours, with meals served during recognized meal periods. A visual daily routine is posted for children. Evacuation procedures are clearly posted in a prominent location.

monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance are posted in a clearly visible and prominent location.

Learning experiences inspired by children's interests and webbing are evident in the art area, library, kitchen, and dramatic play spaces. The sensory area is available and sufficiently stocked with rotated accessories to support engagement. Traffic areas and outdoor walkways are clean and free of clutter. Toxic products, including chemical cleaners, are locked and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is made available throughout the day.

The environment provides opportunities for both individual and group learning experiences. Various forms of literacy are embedded within the indoor space, and portfolios are being created in collaboration with the children. Documentation of learning is visible and demonstrates connections to children's interests and educator reflections.

A conversation with the Administrator highlighted both strengths and areas for growth. Strengths include the development and extension of webs with children, and the presence of multiple forms of documentation throughout the facility. Areas for improvement include ensuring that educators maintain an active and engaged presence outdoors to support children's play, and that art areas are consistently well-stocked with materials such as glue, paper, and scissors to support open-ended artistic exploration.
