<p>General Comments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Early-morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection -Ratio was respected during the visit -The following administrative records are maintained on site: Financial records, daily attendance of children and staff, monthly emergency evacuation fire drills, smoke alarm, smoke detectors and fire extinguisher inspection and maintenance records -Monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills needs to be completed – Once the fire practice is done for the month of March, confirmation will be sent to QAM. -To ensure the children's safety, a review of the outside space is completed daily -Non-prescribed medication locked and kept out of reach of children, in the original label and labeled with the child's name and dosage -Daily routine into a learning center must include an outdoor play time at least once every 4-hour blocks time when the weather is permitting. The operator will need to have a discussion with a parent to ensure that all children have the proper clothing for them to have outdoor playtime during the colder season. -Lunch and snacks are provided at recognized meal periods -Daily rest period is adapted to meet individual needs -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way -When entering the center, posted in the hallway on the left are the following documents: The license, inspection report, orders for compliance, daily routine, evacuation procedures, name of administrator, name and telephone number of the inspector -Life threatening allergies will be posted when it applies a notice to inform parents of the existence of a communicable disease. -The name and telephone number of QA Monitor will need to be posted on the parent board. -Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children

General Comments

- Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child.
- Outdoor material is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present
- Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free of hazards
- It was discussed with the operator on how to write a letter of exception from policy 901 to apply for designated spaces

Observations: When arriving at the center children were into a free play period, they then transitioned to a paint activity. Once they were done painting, they washed their hands and ate their snack.
