Comments: Licensing observed that the monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills were not completed for May 2026. Licensing discussed with Administrators and COO during inspection and a plan was made to ensure these are completed.

Comments: Licensing observed that the diaper changing procedures were not posted in the two washrooms associated with the license. Discussed with COO and Administrators during inspection. Procedures were posted in both washrooms adjacent to the diaper change stations. Deficiency is now compliant			

<p><b>General Comments</b></p> <p>A renewal inspection occurred on the license.</p> <p>Upon arrival at the childcare facility, licensing observed that all the children in the three learning environments were outside in the outdoor classrooms.</p> <p>Licensing observed the following in the inside learning environments while the children were outside.</p> <p>Room 6: Documentation on the walls and in a binder depict the children engaged in a variety of activities. Outside play, painting outside, exploring rocks and puddles, finding colors, playing in the rain and puddles, mark making and tuff tray exploration. The room was set up with a variety of age-appropriate materials for the children to interact and engage with while inside. It was also observed that there were enough materials for the number of children enrolled in this room.</p> <p>In the outdoor learning environment, the children were observed creating with clay and using natural materials, books set up throughout the area on stumps, and going on a scavenger hunt. Educators indicated that during lunch the children go back inside the centre to use the washroom and wash their hands and then head back outside for lunch. Some children would return inside with their educators during nap/quiet time while other children remained outside with their educator.</p>

General Comments

Room 7A: Licensing observed a web regarding sensory, and building were displayed on the walls. Pictures and learning stories depict the children building with recycled materials, (yogurt containers, rocks, sticks, and twigs), exploring loose parts and building with blocks. Licensing observed the children in this room during nap/quiet time. Educators were observed rubbing the children's back to help them settle to sleep. Children were observed sleeping on their cots, spaced appropriately apart as per the licensing requirement. The children in this group were observed playing in their outside learning environment with the children from Room 7B and then going for a walk through the Vanished Kingdom.

Room 7B: Licensing discussed with the Administrator that the walls in the learning environment did not depict the children's learning and Administrator indicated that the educator had posted on Bright Wheel for the parents/guardians. Administrator showed licensing the children's learning via Bright Wheel. Learning stories and pictures sent to families showed the children exploring outside, exploring, and climbing rocks, having a picnic outside with their peers and with the children from Room 7A.

Licensing is recommending that samples of the children's learning be displayed in a binder as licensing does not have access to Bright Wheel and requires evidence of the children's learning that is purposefully planned and documented.

During the inspection, licensing discussed with administrators, chief operating officer, and educators' the supervision of the children in the inside learning environments during diaper changing/toileting when there is one educator with a group of children. Children must be always supervised and educators, when alone with a group of children, must take all the children into the washroom with them during diaper changing/toileting. Discussed ensuring that the door is closed in the washroom with the educator and the children, so the children do not go back into the learning environment alone.

Recommending that mulch/surfacing be added to the outside classrooms under the tire swings, hammocks, and under the rope lines to cover the rocks and roots to ensure the safety of the children during outside play.

Educators were observed by licensing tending to the needs of the children and using positive child guidance techniques during the inspection.
