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<p>General Comments</p> <p>A renewal inspection occurred. Inspector observed the children during inside and outside play, transitions, daily routines, nap/quiet time, lunch, and snack.</p> <p>Upon arrival at the childcare center, Inspector observed that all the groups, except the infants had gone on a walk to the bottle exchange as part of Earth Day. Operator indicated that the children each brought in a bottle to take to the bottle exchange and with the money that they received, an educator, when it was their break, was going to go to Tim Hortons to purchase Tim Bits for the entire childcare center as a treat for their Earth Day activity.</p> <p>In the Infant/Dolphin room Inspector observed the children during multiple transitions as well as peer and educator interactions during the inspection. Educators have documented the children's learning, and it is displayed in both the inside environment as well as a documentation binder.</p> <p>Pictures and learning stories of the children engaged in painting, sensory activities, exploring marble painting, mark making activities, exploring tissue paper, and making a snowstorm from with paint and water were observed.</p> <p>In the 2's/Duckies' room, Inspector observed a documentation binder with learning stories and pictures of the children exploring leaves and raking, having a scavenger hunt, making homemade drums, exploring the outside play area, and going on nature walks with their peers.</p> <p>The 2's/ Busy Bee's room, Inspector observed that the children have been learning about birds and creating birds from feathers, glue, paper and google eyes. A sensory bin was observed with toy birds, nests, scoops, feathers, and seeds for the children to explore. A documentation binder was observed with learning stories and pictures of the children building a snowman outside, baking a friendship cake for their peers and playing matching games.</p> <p>The 3's/Turtle Room, Inspector observed that the children had created a flower garden from paper, markers,</p>

and yarn and this was posted on the wall of the indoor learning environment. Children were also observed engaged in a fine motor activity of picking up pompoms and loose parts with tweezers. The documentation binder had additional evidence of the children's learning; children engaged in stacking plastic eggs with playdough, exploring with flashlights and acrylic blocks, discovering shadows, investigation a frozen puddle and baking with their peers.

The 3/4's/ Monkey Room, Inspector observed a web about "constructing". Pictures and stories of the children putting items together to create objects: bird's nests with sticks, building a book with paper, markers, and tape, constructing a haunted ship from logs, and building a restaurant in the outside play area with large blocks. The children have also been learning about birds: what they eat, sounds they make and several types of birds.

In the 4's/Frogs' room, Inspector observed that the children have had an interest about superheroes. Pictures of the children pretending to be superhero outside in the play area was observed. Children's art was observed displayed on the walls with creation of "Minecraft" characters. Inspector observed 3D Lego creations on the ledge of the room, stored so that the children can work on or play with these later without first having to take them apart.

Inspector discussed documentation and that it can be stored in a binder and to be mindful of how much paper/documentation is displayed on the walls. Recommending Operator Early Learning Consultant-Curriculum for ideas and suggestions about different ways documentation can be displayed.

Inspector observed positive child guidance techniques being followed during the inspection. Educators were observed down at the level of the children in their interactions play and learning.

Facility is recommended for license renewal pending the recommendation from Fire.
