Comments: There was an administration of medication form partially completed for a child who requires an inhaler. Additional information is required as educator was not informed as to under what circumstances this medication should be administered. Educators must be well informed of children's medical conditions and what actions to take in case of emergency. If children have medical conditions-Essential Routine Services and Emergency Plan should be completed. If a child has an extreme allergy-Extreme Allergy Management Plan is to be completed. These should be completed and kept with the child's medication and within the child's file prior to attending facility. There are a number of children with allergies/medical conditions. Licensing staff will follow up on required documentation at follow up inspection. To be completed as soon as possible.

Adding pieces like area rugs, chairs, soft lighting, and books that are displayed on shelves will invite the children to spend time in this area.

Ensure that the new online system includes all required registration information as outlined in Appendix 1 and 2 of the Operator Manual. Much of this information was missing today within multiple files. Recommending that staff review all child profiles to ensure they have all required information and consent forms.

Ensure that Extreme Allergy Management Plans and Essential Routine Services Plans are completed as required.
