General Comments									
A Monitoring Inspection was conducted this afternoon on July 11, 2024.									
Children were observed engaging in indoor free play activities.									
Educators reported that the children are currently highly interested in summer-themed activities, including field trips to local farms, sports play, creating art using recycled materials, and an upcoming visit to the splash pad.									
Parents are informed of incidents, and incident report forms are completed as necessary. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and their procedures are visibly posted. Daily routines are displayed in each room, along with clear evacuation procedures and a notice informing parents about communicable diseases.									
The facility is equipped with a diverse range of appropriate materials, books, toys, and several distinct learning centers such as building areas, reading corners, and dramatic play spaces. Children's artwork is prominently displayed throughout the facility.									
Traffic areas indoors are maintained clean, and outdoor walkways are clear of clutter. Hazardous materials and chemical products and cleaners are securely stored and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is readily available throughout the day, and outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of									

appropriate depth.

The curriculum supports both individual and group learning experiences, incorporating various forms of literacy within the indoor environment. Educators actively extend group experiences outdoors and strive to integrate community elements into the play spaces.
