QAM observed children and educators engaged within a variety of activities. Some of these activities included playdough, block building and dramatic play. All groups spent extra time outside today, enjoying the sunshine and spring like weather. Educators were engaged – participating in play, conversing with the children, and

asking open ended questions, while listening attentively, while the children spoke.

Documentation within each learning environment was displayed at the children's level. Documentation included photos, learning stories, webs and open-ended art pieces. Children's current interests (snowbanks, snow, ice, rough and tumble play, trains, calendars) were evident within each learning environment.

A yearly calendar was displayed within the Preschool Room. It included photos of the children and special events. Educators stated that the children enjoy the calendar and that they are often observed at the calendar, having discussions with their peers. Children's words, which were added to the calendar as a form of documentation, were also observed.

Educators stated that the toddlers were currently interested in gross motor and rough and tumble play. A variety of gross motor materials were observed in the toddler room.

The educators from the infant room had the morning to purposefully plan as a team. Extra staff are brought into each room, one morning a week, to allow for planning, documenting, and setting up learning environments. Smooth transitions were observed between activities. Extra staff were observed helping the infants get their mittens, boots, and snowsuits on.

French toast casserole with berries was served for snack and chicken alfredo was served for lunch.

Hand washing routines were observed.

New staff files were reviewed.
