General Comments

On the morning of June 5, 2024, a Monitoring Inspection took place at the childcare facility. Observations were made during the transition period from outdoor to indoor free play. The children were seen practicing proper handwashing as they moved inside, facilitated by the use of steps or platforms that enabled them to reach regular-sized toilets and sinks. Educators noted that the children currently show a keen interest in a variety of activities, including sensory provocations, gross motor activities involving balance beams, and open-ended art projects. The educators were observed utilizing positive language and providing gentle reminders, demonstrating effective child guidance techniques. These techniques included interacting at the children's level, maintaining appropriate supervision, offering choices, and assisting children in decision-making.

The facility maintains all required records and documents for a year, along with a daily incident log. Parents of children at the center have unrestricted access and can enter at any time. Important documents such as the license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and orders for compliance are posted in a clearly visible and prominent location. The daily routine is also displayed in the room. The room itself is inviting and well-organized, with materials set up to encourage play. Books reflecting the children's interests are available, and several well-defined learning centers such as building, reading, dramatic play, and science are present. Traffic areas and outdoor walkways are kept clean and free of clutter.

The curriculum is thoughtfully planned and documented, offering a variety of literacy forms within the indoor environment. There are ample opportunities for children to express creativity, explore the arts and sciences, experience accomplishments, solve problems, and develop trusting, respectful, and supportive relationships.
