General Comments

Monitoring Inspection:

Children observed engaged in a variety of activities this afternoon including art, playdoh, puzzles, science experiments, outdoor play and gym games.

Mini Gym:

Play materials are unorganized on shelves and are not divided into defined interest centers. The environment is to be decluttered, organized and set-up in a way that encourages children to engage in play. QA Monitor discussed with staff moving shelving closer to tables and chairs to encourage children to sit and engage with materials. Dramatic play materials are becoming in poor repair; to be replaced and replenished. Recommend creating a dramatic play area with real-life materials and an area that is separate for gross motor play. The rug is accumulating dirt and debris to be vacuumed regularly.

One group from the Mini Gym did not go outside this afternoon. Ensure each group participates in outdoor play each day for at least one hour.

Each child was greeted by staff at arrival and welcomed to the after-school program.

Children in the Mini Gym did not wash their hands at arrival or before snack. Ensure hand washing routines are reviewed and implemented with children and staff.

Rice cakes and apples were served for snack.

Daily attendance records are accurate and reflect all children present. Child-to-staff ratio was observed to be met during Monitoring Inspection. Educators observed conducting frequent headcounts to ensure all children are present.

New staff file (3) review was completed. Two new staff files were not on-site during inspection; QA Monitor was able to confirm documents through email. Staff files must be on-site or accessible within a reasonable amount of time.
