During the monitoring inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor noticed in the classroom that some of the lunches brought from home were not labelled with the child's name. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed lunches boxes all piled one on top of the other, some were not labelled with the child's name, the Quality Assurance Monitor also notice a few lunches lying around on shelves in Ziploc bags not labelled with the child's name. The Quality Assurance Monitor informed the administrator that an operator of a licensed facility may supply food to a child receiving services at the licensed facility that a parent or guardian or the child brings from the child's home if the food is labelled with the child's name and refrigerated, as required.

During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor was able to observe children playing outdoors followed by being divided in different groups indoor depending on the interest of the child.

A discussion between the operator and Quality Assurance Monitor was had in regards of a behavior think sheet that was observed in children's records. The Quality Assurance Monitor questioned the reason behind having these sheets for the children. The operator explained that the facility had started this behavior think sheet for children to be able to empathize when they have inappropriate behavior and explain why it happened and what could they do next time to make it better? The Quality Assurance Monitor mentioned that a section on the sheet was observed, that mentioned what would be a reasonable consequence for the behavior , the Quality Assurance Monitor recommended to the operator to remove this section of the behavior think sheet in order to be in compliance with regulation 49(2): An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that no child receiving services at the licensed facility is subjected to any form of physical punishment or verbal or emotional abuse or is denied physical necessities.
