Comments: In one classroom, the Quality Assurance Monitor found an X-Acto knife on a drawer. The indoor play area must be maintained safe and clean. The educator immediately locked the X-Acto knife. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: During the monitoring, the Quality Assurance Monitor found a bottle of shaving cream and a bottle of dish soap in an unlocked cabinet. Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies must be locked and inaccessible to children. The educator immediately locked the product. Deficiency is now compliant.			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site for a monitoring inspection.</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor verified the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Administrative records maintained on site -Indoor play area and material -Washrooms -Health -Safety -Storage space <p>While taking the ratio in the classroom, the Quality Assurance Monitor observes an educator alone in a classroom with 14 preschool kids. The QAM asked where the other educator where was, she was at the washroom. The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the administrator regarding this situation. Going to the washroom is a necessity for the educators. The ratio, the safety and the well being of the children must be maintained at all times. The Quality Assurance Monitor suggest having another educator or staff member who is not in the ratio to replace the staff when they need to use the washroom.</p>

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor had a conversation with the operator in regard of the coding on the attendance sheet. The days that the children are not enrolled (part time), a code for the reason of absence is not necessary.

In a preschool room, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed a lack of art material. The art center only has a couple of papers and crayons. The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the educator and administrator regarding adding different and sufficient kinds of art material that are accessible to the children at all times.

The Quality Assurance Monitor observed the children eating their snack. Children were also observed playing in the indoor play area and transitioning to the outdoor play area. Positive interactions were observed between the children and the educators.
