Comments: Ratios were not maintained when the educator had to leave the children unsupervised during pick-up time when parents were arriving.								

General Comments

When I arrived for the monitoring visit, the children were making bracelets.

Despite being within ratio, this facility would strongly benefit from having two staff on site at all times, one of which is a staff with additional experience.

The children and educator were both asking me for help beyond what is normally seen within our roles as Quality Assurance Monitors. The needs of the children outweighed the educator's experience. She required assistance with managing child behaviors, assisting the children with their craft, following protocols for a sick child, and locating the first aid kit. Children were also left unsupervised in the classroom and gym during pick-up time when parents were arriving.

The daily routine of the afternoon did not respond to the needs and interests of the children. Children were required to either color, read books or other table-top activities after the bracelet making craft. Despite two children going to a quiet space on the floor to color, the educator had the children return to the table. When building with Legos in the play tent, children were asked to remain seated after trying to fly around their Lego creations. The program needs to allow for spontaneous activities if children are no longer interested in what is being offered.

I did observe the educator speaking kindly to the children in a low voice and offering praise at times, however, please ensure that child guidance practices remain positive even with challenging behaviors and do not include limiting activities or choices such as listening to music or moving beyond a certain area of the room with materials. It is important to remember that tools such as a red, yellow and green traffic light system of behavior is not best practice and child guidance should include positive reinforcement and encouragement.

The children were not provided any outdoor time today and this is a requirement under Regulations 21(b) and 22(a). The children ate lunch when they arrived from school and then were required to do seated activities, mainly at the table until 3:30 pm. Choices were often limited to reading books or coloring. They did go to the indoor gym but towards the end of the day.

Please remember to complete and record fire drills each month. The last recorded fire drill was in December 2021.
