the 3 year old educators and they were inspired by the children's interest in building and forts. They covered the climbing structure, picnic table and gazebo with sheets and hung several sheets and blankets from structures with clips that the children could remove, if chosen. Children were immediately drawn to the sheets when they arrived in the playground running under the sheets and climbing under the constructed blanket forts. One child

especially liked running through all three hanging sheets while two other children wrapped themselves into a

The educators engaged with the children throughout the playground sitting to play and giving children reminders of language to use with friends in play. Many children spent the hour outside running around the play structures. The children were given a reminder for going back inside and children transitioned from playing to lining up. Children are very familiar with the routine and changed their shoes, washed their hands and sat at the tables when they returned inside for lunch. Today's lunch was tomato soup, crackers, banana, and a grilled cheese. One educator sat and ate her lunch with the children while another comforted a child having a harder day. After lunch and washing up again, children grabbed a book on the carpet and waited for invitations to be set up. Educators asked children to clean their books up and choose an area to play with a little reminder to a few children of the numbers in each group. Children returned back outside after everyone was finished lunch and had some playtime inside.

Remember that inclusion support workers cannot be counted in the ratio during the day as a relief staff when the child they are supporting is present and awake at the centre.
