General Comments

When I arrived, the children were having a snack and preparing to go outside.

I did not get to see one of the groups today, as they were outside and in the cabin during my inspection.

The rooms are clean and well organized. A lot of natural elements and materials in the classrooms. Some classrooms did not have all the required minimum materials. As discussed, each indoor play area must minimally contain the following:

• art materials including loose parts; • blocks and accessories; • language and literacy; • dramatic play; • music and movement; • large muscle (gross motor); • manipulative and fine motor; • sand and water play; • puzzles and games; • materials that support mathematical learning; and • materials that support learning in science and technology.

There are learning stories on the walls showing what the children are learning about and the activities they are engaging in. There is a poster on the wall showing that the children are collecting maple syrup and are documenting the progress and learning about the process of making maple syrup and the ways you can eat it. Staff was able to show their planning books and show that programming is pre-planned.

The staff were observed engaged with the children. Staff were seen sitting on the floor and playing with the children. Staff were observed speaking to the children at their level and providing gentle reminders when needed.

As discussed, a rest period may take the form of a quiet time. Children who do not nap are not required to rest. Therefore, children who do not nap or want to rest, are not required to lay on mats and cannot be forced to do so. Therefore, during rest period, children who don't nap or rest, are provided with quiet activities. Please see Operator Manual section 7.2 Daily routine and 9.2.3 Rest area, for further information.

When the school age children arrived, they had a snack and then engaged in the activity of their choice and the educator also read a St Patrick Day theme book with them. In the afternoon, the preschool children were seen
