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| General Comments |
| <p>Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct a Monitoring Inspection. Upon arrival, all classes had just transitioned to the outdoor play area. Water bottles, a first aid kit and attendance records were brought outside. Several children were heard laughing and singing as they pulled their peers around the playground on the sleds. Another small group of children were sitting together using shovels to scoop snow into a bucket. The children explained they were making a snow castle village.</p> <p>The outdoor environment offered a variety of play materials, all of which were in good condition. A large wooden house/shed is where toys are stored. The children were able to freely explore, pulling out the materials they wished to play with. Near the wooden mud kitchen, four milk crates full of play materials such as pots, pants, utensils and mixing bowls were observed. The Educators were actively engaged with the children throughout the morning while playing outside. The Educators were observed assisting children with hats, mittens and offering tissues when needed. One Educator played several active games and also was seen dancing and singing with the children.</p> <p>The transition from the outdoor play area back inside was smooth. The 2-year-old class went inside first followed by the 3-year-old class. The Educators encouraged independence with the children as they removed their hats, mittens and snowsuits. Proper diaper changing procedures were followed and all children were observed washing their hands. Before starting lunch, the classes had free play. In the 2-year-old class the Educator sat with the children and read "How to Catch a Snowman". Meanwhile, children in the 3-year-old class were observed drawing pictures of their families, playing dress up and looking through books. A headcount was observed in the 3-year-old class before the group left the classroom to wash their hands for lunch.</p> <p>Only positive child guidance was observed during today's Monitoring Inspection. The Educators crouched down to interact with the children at their level. They were attentive to the needs of the children and were observed offering hugs and words of praise. Several positive changes were noted in the 4-year-old classroom. The room has been painted, and a new cozy corner has been added. The hallway/room by the washroom has also been painted.</p> |
