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General Comments Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct the annual Renewal Inspection. Upon arrival, the Educator was organizing the indoor environment in preparation for the children's arrival. In the cubby area, new labelled bins and hooks were observed for each child. The Educator greeted the children at the bus stop, and attendance records were updated accordingly. The group transitioned indoors, where the children washed their hands. Some children chose to have afternoon snack while others engaged in a game of pool or created Lego structures. In the main front classroom, a pool table and foosball table were observed. In the larger play area, a new craft table and cushions for the children to sit on had recently been added. A variety of art and craft materials, including markers, pencil crayons, glue, scissors, and paper, were stored on a nearby shelf. Two large bins of Lego, a Lego table, books, card games, and board games were also available to the children and appeared to be in good condition. A verbal reminder was provided before the children gathered their personal belongings and transitioned outside. Once outside, the Educator gathered the children together and reviewed the classroom expectations. The outdoor play space offered a variety of play materials and equipment, including ball hockey equipment, nets, soccer balls, footballs, and a mud kitchen with accessories. Some children engaged in imaginative play at the mud kitchen, pretending to make coffee, while others played hockey or kicked a soccer ball. Families were greeted during end of day pick up, and attendance records were updated accordingly. Only positive child guidance practices were observed during the inspection. Child and staff profiles were reviewed on site and contained all required documentation. Licensing Staff recommends renewal.
