General Comments

The center is still ensuring that everyone who enters does not have any COVID symptoms and that visitors are logged in. They also ensure distancing can still be followed by allowing only a certain number of parents in at one time.

While there, I verified staff files of newer staff members and all necessary information and current checks are included in each file. The files are well organized.

During my visit, some children were dancing inside before going out to play, while other groups were playing and then having lunch. They were getting ready for nap and quiet time as I was leaving. I looked at each of the classrooms during my visit and I noted that there are a sufficient variety of materials for each group. The classrooms do not have to be divided anymore because the 'bubbles' are no longer required, and this makes the rooms more spacious again. It also allows some of the three year olds who nap to join other children who nap on the main level where it is more quiet during that time.

Programming is done a little bit differently in the summer for some of the classes. There are summer camp weeks where they focus on a different topic each week. However, the children's interests are still observed and are taken into account when planning, which is curriculum-based. For example, it is nature week. The children were interested in the moths they saw by the doorway when they would come in, and so a planned activity was to create moths or other bugs with art supplies. These were displayed on the wall along with other work the children have been doing. Each classroom has children's work displayed throughout. There are also guest visitors who will be coming to the center for different weeks. For example, a guest bringing fossils during nature week, or musicians coming in to play songs and sing with the children during music week.

Things seemed to be running well during my visit.
