Comments: As discussed some of the children's rooms require more materials and learning centres set up.

Comments: There is a storage closet by infant room that has a sliding lock which is no longer approved by the Department. There were tools and toxic products stored in this area and the sliding lock was not in place. Likewise, in the kitchen, the toxics were unlocked and no one was present. Please replace the sliding lock and insure that all toxics are always under lock and key.			
50(2) The operator of a licensed facility shall inform the parent or guardian of a child involved in an incident on the day the incident takes place and shall ensure that the parent or guardian signs the daily log to confirm their awareness.	50(2)	Aug 06, 2021	
Comments: Daily logs are not being signed by parents.			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>Positive child guidance was seen at time of visit. Children were spoken to in a developmentally appropriate way and redirected when necessary.</p> <p>Documentation was apparent in most rooms but it is important that pre-planning and documentation continues to occur even in the summer months. There were crafts evident in some of the children's room and a few of the age groups were enjoying a slip and slide in the back yard.</p> <p>The three year old class were going on an outing at the time of visit. Discussed insurance with Director which prompted a call to the insurance agent where they found out that they were not covered. Advised Operator that each driver would have to obtain a policy that states that they are covered for daycare transportation. The 3 year olds ended up walking to a nearby restaurant for icecream instead.</p>

General Comments

Educators should directly supervise nap for all children. However, when napping children not directly supervised, a physical check of the children must occur every 15 minutes. However, It further clarifies that Health Canada states that playpens are not intended to be used for unsupervised sleep as they do not meet the same safety requirements and are not as durable as cribs, therefore, playpens are not recommended for unsupervised sleep of children. If you continue to use playpens, moving forward, a staff will have to be in the nap room at all times. Operator is ordering cribs.

Please be advised that when going to public swims the ratios are as follows incase the choice is ever made to go:

Infants: 1:1

Preschool 1;4

School-age 1:8

Also, Discussed and clarified the criteria of reporting to social development with staff. Staff and Director were advised that there only has to be a suspicion of child abuse to make a call.
