General Comments
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Mid-day visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection -Ratio was respected during the visit -The following administrative records are maintained on site: Financial records, daily attendance of children and staff, monthly emergency evacuation fire drills, smoke alarm, smoke detectors and fire extinguisher inspection and maintenance records -Monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills are completed -To ensure the children's safety, a review of the outside space is completed daily -Daily routine into a learning center includes an outdoor play time once every 4-hour blocks time when the weather is permitting -Lunch and snacks are provided at recognized meal periods -Daily rest period is adapted to meet individual needs -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way -Toxic products, and cleaning supplies are locked under key and are inaccessible to children -Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child. -Children's indoor play area is safe and clean -Material and equipment proposed to children in the indoor play area are easily accessible on low, open shelves. It is varied and in sufficient quantity for all children present. -The ice in front of the gateway that leads to the infant's outdoor play, needs to be broken so the door can open freely, at this moment infants cannot play in their playground because of the ice. Once it is done, a picture will be sent by email. -To make the infant's outdoor play area safe, sand or salt needs to be spread on the ice, so the infants can utilize their play area safely

General Comments

Observations: When arriving at the center the two's and the infants were napping. The three-year-old got all ready to go play outside, while the four-year-old group was into free play; building towers, drawings, playing music instruments, building roads and pretend play. Projects on the wall was showing the germination of the seed and children were singing the seed song invented by their educator.
