### General Comments

I signed in upon arrival and observed the indoor environment and the documentation of learning today. I also observed the program planning process. There are sufficient age-appropriate materials and activities for the children to do in each classroom. The rooms all displayed an abundance of children's work. There were paintings, crafts, pine cone bats, Halloween crafts, art with leaves and sparkles, art created with different mediums, among other forms of work. Each classroom had centers set up, and all toys, art supplies, music, loose parts, puzzles and games accessible to the children.

I saw written program planning today, and I encourage the educators to continue working on their program planning using the curriculum. I saw many creative and fun ideas in the planning. Observations are also important to write down about how the programming went with the groups. Many learning stories were displayed in all the classrooms and in the hallways for the children and parents to be able to see. They were well done, and some were more up to date, while others dated back to the summer. I suggest that these be updated more frequently.

The school age children were at the center all day due to there being no school. The educators did a good job of balancing the children's play with school work. The children who wanted to do school work were able to do it at certain times and they also had time to go outside, to have free time, and to create art and crafts such as poppies.

I observed the interactions of educators and children in each room. The educators demonstrated positive child guidance and used active listening, redirection, distraction, and gentle reminders. I also saw that the educators were flexible and were quick to tend to the needs of the children. All staff showed attentive care and kindness to the children.

Everything appeared to go well during my visit.
