General Comments
Licensing staff arrived at the licensed facility to conduct the annual License Renewal Inspection. Upon arrival, licensing staff observed children in the two/three-year-old classroom engaged in free play within the outdoor play environment. A group of children were enthusiastically jumping in a mud puddle that had formed following rainfall over the previous few days. During this activity, one child asked their educator if they could look for worms, similar to those they had discovered the day before. The educator responded by accompanying the children around the playground to search for worms, supporting their curiosity and exploration of the natural environment. While observing the school-age program indoors, licensing staff noted that the children were participating in a special activity with a "mystery reader." The mystery reader was a local RCMP officer who visited the facility to read the story Lemon the Duck and engage in a question-and-answer session with the children. Following the story, one child asked the officer whether she carried pepper spray. The officer explained that she does carry pepper spray; however, it remained secured in her vehicle, as it is not permitted inside the licensed facility for safety reasons. All classrooms contained documentation of children's learning that was displayed at children's eye level, allowing them to reflect on their experiences and learning. Each classroom offered a variety of well-defined play centres and developmentally appropriate materials, including mark-making materials, art and craft supplies, loose parts, cozy areas, dramatic play resources, trucks, tractors, ramps, LEGO, and other engaging play materials. A review of educator and child records confirmed that all files were complete and contained the required documentation. Licensing staff recommends the facility for license renewal.
