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<p>General Comments</p> <p>A monitoring inspection occurred in the morning.</p> <p>Infant Room 1: The children were observed in a variety of activities that included climbing on the foam play blocks, pushing the push walkers, rolling the new sensory reflective mystery balls, and sitting with their educator that was reading a book. Additionally, the children were observed eating snack with hand washing occurring beforehand. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in outside, music, gross motor activities, and books.</p> <p>Infant Room 2: The children were observed finishing their snack. Once they were done, they washed their hands and prepared to transition outdoors. Educators shared that the children are currently interested in birds, sensory activities, specifically painting, and books.</p> <p>Two-Three-Year-Old Room: The children were observed transitioning from outdoors to the room. The children sat with their educator singing songs and reading books, several children were observed using puzzles, sensory bottles, and playing with cars. Additionally, the children were observed eating lunch with hand washing occurring beforehand. Lunch today consisted of fish sticks, rice, corn, green beans, and apple sauce.</p> <p>Four-Five-Year-Old Room: The children were observed in the gym engaged in a variety of activities that included riding busy boards, listening to music, and navigating and obstacle course. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in music, Easter, cars, Lego and building with blocks.</p> <p>Positive child guidance techniques were observed. The educators were observed to be engaging at the children's level, providing appropriate supervision, using encouraging language, offering choices, and assisting children with decision-making.</p> <p>Several forms of documentation were visible throughout all rooms, including photographs, learning stories, learning webs and children's artwork. The rooms were well-organized and inviting, offering a varied supply of age-appropriate materials, books, and toys.</p>
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General Comments

A clearly visible and prominent area was designated for posting the facility license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documents reviewed included incident logs, daily attendance records, daily information sheets, three staff files, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills.
