Upon Licensing staff arrival to conduct the renewal inspection, the children had just finished eating morning

snack.
The classrooms were tidy and play material such as blocks, magnet tiles, bins of dinosaurs, play kitchens, art supplies and literacy material were in good condition. Children from the preschool age classrooms were observed playing with playdoh and building towers with foam colourful foam blocks. Positive child guidance was observed while encouraging sharing among friends and positive words of encouragement were heard.
Before going outdoors, the preschool age children were encouraged to use the bathroom. Proper handwashing was observed. The daily attendance records, water bottles and first aid kit bag were taken outdoors. The outdoor play area was fully fenced and secured with a gate. Children were observed playing on painted tires, dancing to "the floor is lava", using chalk boards, and digging with shovels and scoops. A discussion occurred with the on-site Administrator/Educators in regard to natural play material ideas as well as the addition of a second surface for the preschool age outdoor play. With the change in seasons, please ensure that summer toys are put away and any broken play material is removed.
As the preschool age children returned indoors for lunch, there was evidence of daily routine as after the children washed their hands, an Educator said, "ok let's go to the green bench." The children sat together and took turns changing their outdoor footwear, hanging up sweaters and getting their lunch bags. During lunch, the children in each classroom sat together at the table. Educators were engaged in conversation with the children and were observed offering assistance with lunch item packages.
After lunch, the floors were swept, tables were cleaned, before nap cots and personal belongings were set up for nap time. The rooms were calm, and soft music was played to help the children fall asleep. Shortly after the preschool age children fell asleep, the school-age children arrived. Upon their arrival, an Educator greeted them from the bus. High-fives and a headcount were observed as each child came up the stairs. Personal belongings were hung up, and proper handwashing was observed before the school-age children ate their lunch. After lunch, the school-age children went outdoors to play. Children were observed playing soccer, playing with trucks, and drawing.
During inspection, staff and child files were verified. Please ensure that the Operators staff file is on site at all times. Monthly fire drills are being conducted and logged, and emergency evacuation procedures were posted. There were current learning stories on display and evidence of purposeful planning.
