General Comments

On August 13, 2024, a Monitoring Inspection was conducted.

During the observation, children were seen engaging in outdoor free play and enjoying lunch time. Educators reported that the children are currently very enthusiastic about outdoor activities, creating with loose parts, and caring for their summer gardening. Educators use open-ended questions and actively listen to children's responses, employing paraphrasing to confirm their understanding. They engage with children by discussing ideas, asking questions, and expanding on the children's thoughts, while also incorporating their own interests into their documentation. Outdoors, educators play an active role in supporting children's activities.

The facility allows parents of children present at the center to enter at any time. Snacks are provided at least every three hours, and meals are served at recognized meal periods. The room is set up to be inviting, with materials arranged to encourage play. Ideas from the web and learning stories are reflected in the art, library, kitchen, and dramatic play areas, and books are chosen based on the children's interests. Children's art is displayed at eye level, with names and dates included. The infant outdoor play area is separate or used at different times from other areas, and outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.

The curriculum includes purposefully planned and documented daily activities, providing opportunities for both individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are present in the indoor environment, alongside opportunities for creativity, exploration of the arts and sciences, problem-solving, and the development of trusting relationships. Portfolios are completed with the children, who have access to them. Several forms of documentation were observed throughout the facility. Educators make efforts to extend the curriculum outdoors and integrate the natural world into the classroom.
