Comments: Deficiency is now compliant Observed Gain laundry detergent on top of washer/dryer combo and Nolitron air freshener on top paper towel dispenser at time of inspection. Administrator locked toxic products before end of inspection.			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>Both groups of children were playing with either slim or playdough when I arrived for today's monitoring inspection. Children who were playing with slim were eager to explain to me what color their slim was, that it had sparkles in it, and that it made purple by mixing two different colors together. The other group was excited to show me the different color playdough they were playing with and the tools they were using while playing with playdough.</p> <p>All educators were observed interacting with children at time of inspection. They were observed sitting and playing with children and reading them stories.</p> <p>During today's monitoring inspection, the indoor environment was observed to contain a wide variety of play materials that follow the values and beliefs of the New Brunswick Curriculum Framework for Early Learning and Childcare. These materials included many natural pieces such as Wicker baskets, wooden blocks, pinecones, and other natural resources.</p> <p>The outside environment also offers an abundance of natural play material for the children to play with, from a wooden bridge, to lose parts, stumps/benches, and a boat, etc.</p>

General Comments

The facility's indoor environment also offers a very bright and caring atmosphere for children to grow, learn and thrive in. The preschool rooms have an abundance of learning materials that meet the interests of the children. The indoor environment is also set up in a way that promotes independence by having all play material on low shelves so that the children can pick and choose what they wish to play with.

Educator files that were observed today were in compliance with licensing regulations.
