Comments:

During renewal inspection positive child guidance practices were not observed in one of the classrooms. Educators were overheard raising their voices at children during transition time such as getting ready to go play outside and during the naptime routine. The environment did not have a calming effect on the children as children were observed running around and screaming. Educators repeated the same directions multiple time, each time raising the tone of their voice and mentioning potential consequences to the lack of actions by the children to follow the directions given.

Inspector discussed her observation with two administrators on-site who confirmed they had observed the same issues in the past and had previously addressed it. Inspector pressed to the administrator that it is their responsibility to ensure that the service the children are receiving at the facility is positive and includes positive reinforcements, encouraging efforts and recognizing accomplishments.

Positive guidance techniques are to be used to support and encourage children in learning independence and appropriate acceptable behaviours. These practices help to develop relationships that promote children's well-being and sense of belonging. All educators must read section 8.2 Child guidance (page 60-62) of the Full-time and Part-time Early Learning and Childcare center Operator manual.

Operator must follow-up with the Quality Assurance monitor to discuss measures put in place to ensure positive child guidance practices are maintained at all time.

General Comments

COVID-19 Guidance for Early Learning and Childcare Facilities.

Screening was done on the inspectors upon arrival at the main facility. Screening is currently being done at the main door and then children are brought to respective classrooms. Inspector recommends having the APPENDIX D - Daily Log available at the door for anyone arriving during the day. Screening questionnaires should also be available on site.

Inspector discussed the cleaning logs with the operator. Cleaning is being done and logs are being filed. Inspector discussed having the staff initial after each task has been completed. Operator and staff should see APPENDIX C - CLEANING AND DESINFECTION page 21-27 for cleaning methods used on various toys. Inspector also discussed wearing mask for common areas were educators might meet as well as having the relief staff, kitchen and cleaning staff wear mask when moving around in the facility. Inspector recommends reading page 8 and 9 of the COVID-19 Guidance for Early Learning and Childcare Facilities document. Inspector also discussed the classroom group logs and the staff logged in each classroom. Group logs should represent the children and staff working in that classroom.

The soap dispenser in the kitchen is broken. Soap must be available for handwashing at all time. operator is to ensure soap is available at each handwashing station.

Children were observed playing outside while respecting their groupings, during renewal inspection.
