<p>General Comments</p> <p>I saw a lot of positive communication and interaction between educators and children. The facility uses a program where they can communicate with parents and share learning stories. I reviewed this program in one of the classrooms and saw lots of wonderful photos of activities that the children have done over the last few weeks. Many of the classrooms were outside or out in the community on filed trips.</p> <p>Toxic products and medication were found in the toddler room unlocked. Toxic products were also found in the infant room locked however, not locked by key. Medication and toxic products must always be locked by key.</p> <p>On and after July 1, 2020, at least 50% of educators must hold a one-year Early Childhood Education Certificate or equivalent.</p> <p>Covid 19: All surfaces, especially those general surfaces that are frequently touched, such as door knobs, handrails, toys etc should be cleaned and disinfected at least twice daily and when soiled. Toys that have been put in a child's mouth must be cleaned and disinfected, and then rinsed with potable water before being used by another child.</p> <p>A cleaning and disinfection schedule must be in place with clear accountabilities assigned to specific staff.</p> <p>All soiled surfaces should be cleaned before disinfecting, unless otherwise stated on the product.</p>
