General Comments
Children were playing outside when licensing staff arrived. One educator in the infant room was blowing bubbles with children encouraging them to try while the second educator was sitting in the sandbox with two children following their lead in play. Educators responded to children's comments by asking questions and relating to their experiences. A relief staff arrived to give the educator in the sandbox a break and sat down with the children continuing the play of the educator respecting their choice of play. Children were given a reminder of going inside beforehand and when they arrived inside, each child took a seat at the table to wait to get their hands washed and ready for lunch. As one educator washed the children's hands, the second educator began preparing each child's lunch on their own plate asking children if they knew what each food item was and counting how many plates and servings would be needed. Today was taco salad with grapes and one child was excited that there were sauces (sour cream and salsa) which the educators talked about with the child. One child said they didn't like salsa and the educator suggested giving a little for the child to try if they changed their mind. The children in the senior nursery room were out for a walk to the park in the morning and arrived for lunch choosing to eat outside at the child-size picnic table. Children were offered additional servings and educators read children's cues of moving around and playing to indicate they were done. Each child's hands and face were cleaned up and children moved around the outdoor area to play while everyone finished. As soon as everyone was done and cleaned up, they returned inside for naptime. The two-year-old group was on a field trip in the morning, having a picnic lunch before returning to the centre for naptime. The room was ready for naps when children returned.

General Comments

Documentation was evident throughout each room with multiple photo collages of children at play. Invitations were documented with connections to the curriculum in rooms and the hallway. Nursery rhymes were posted at the children's level as well as learning stories and photos. New cubbies and sinks, and some updates to each room have been ongoing and make the spaces more accessible for children and educators.
