Comments: While entering new staff members in the system, the Quality Assurance Monitor noticed that a staff member first aid certificate was not valid. The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the staff member in question and the administrator to inform them that the certificate was not valid. The administrator confirmed that a new course will be booked and the staff member in question won't be left alone with a group of children.							
General Comments							
The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site for a monitoring inspection. Ratio was respected during the visit.							
The Quality Assurance Monitor was able to verify these elements of the check list: - Posted in a visible and prominent place in the facility. - Indoor play area materials and equipment							
During the monitoring inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor observed children from the preschool class playing with big ice balls that had fake ants in them, and the children in both infant rooms were playing indoor. The Quality Assurance Monitor also observed children from the preschool room play in the gym area instead of outside due to the weather not permitting them to go play outside.							
The Quality Assurance Monitor noticed in the infant room although they had crayons, markers and papers, they were not on a low shelves and easily accessible to children. The educators explained that they keep them out of reach of children because the children put the crayons and markers in their mouth or will colour all over. The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the educators and recommended that they put the crayons and markers in clear container with a lid that children are not able to open by themselves. This way the child will still be able to reach the crayons and show the educators the interest in colouring.
