One waste basket used for soiled diapers was found uncovered. To comply with Health Inspection Standard 3.3 for Diaper Changing, waste baskets for diaper disposal must be tightly covered and lined with a disposable trash bag, placed outside of children's play areas. Please ensure that a lid that can be securely closed is added to the waste basket.

Additionally, one potty seat in the washroom was soiled. To meet Public Health Standard 3.6 for Facility Maintenance, a written cleaning and sanitizing schedule should include detailed instructions on the areas and items that need to be cleaned. Sanitary facilities must be maintained in a hygienic manner, and potty seats should be sanitized after each use.

General Comments

This afternoon, June 19, 2024, a Monitoring Inspection took place.

ventilation and other general health standards under the Public Health

During the inspection, children were observed during indoor and outdoor free play, snack time, and nap time. Educators mentioned that the children are currently very interested in integrating the outside environment inside, exploring the life cycle of butterflies, and engaging in sensory exploration with water. The educators were observed using positive language and providing gentle reminders to the children.

At the facility, parents of children present are granted entry at any time. Outdoor play is scheduled for at least one hour in each four-hour block when the majority of children are in attendance, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and the procedures are posted for visibility. A prominent location is available for posting the license, current inspection report, current monitoring reports, and orders for compliance. Snacks are provided at least 3 hours apart, and meals are served at recognized meal periods. The daily routine is posted in each room, and evacuation procedures are also clearly displayed.

A notice to inform parents of any communicable diseases is posted visibly. The facility is equipped with a varied supply of appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys. Toxic products, such as chemicals and cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to the children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. The infant outdoor play area is either separate from or used at different times than the areas for older children.
