General Comments

A Monitoring Inspection occurred May 8, 2025.

Children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor play. They demonstrated active participation in a range of activities. Educators reported that the children are currently very interested in Mother's Day crafts using buttons, fabric, and fabric paint. Other popular activities include being active outdoors, playing sports, using laptops for games, finger knitting, making pom poms, and solving whiteboard puzzles as a group practice. Educators support children's interests by engaging in meaningful conversations, asking open-ended questions, and expanding on ideas presented by the children to foster critical thinking and creativity.

A daily incident log is maintained to ensure documentation of any occurrences. In the event of a reportable incident, parents are informed, and appropriate incident report forms are completed. Monthly emergency evacuations are practiced and visibly posted. Licensing documentation, current inspection and monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance are displayed in a clearly visible and accessible location. The daily routine is posted in each room, and evacuation procedures are prominently displayed. Life-threatening allergies are also clearly posted for staff awareness. Upon arrival, families are greeted with enthusiasm, promoting a welcoming environment. Books selected reflect the children's interests, supporting engagement and literacy development. The facility offers a wide variety of developmentally appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys. Toxic products, such as cleaners, are stored securely and kept out of children's reach. Drinking water is made available throughout the day. Outdoor stationary equipment is safely surrounded by protective surfacing of the appropriate depth.
