A daily incident log is maintained to ensure documentation of any occurrences. In the event of a reportable incident, parents are informed, and appropriate incident report forms are completed. Monthly emergency evacuations are practiced and visibly posted. Licensing documentation, current inspection and monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance are displayed in a clearly visible and accessible location. The daily routine is posted in each room, and evacuation procedures are prominently displayed. Life-threatening allergies are also clearly posted for staff awareness. Upon arrival, families are greeted with enthusiasm, promoting a welcoming environment. Books selected reflect the children's interests, supporting engagement and literacy development. The facility offers a wide variety of developmentally appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys. Toxic products, such as cleaners, are stored securely and kept out of children's reach. Drinking water is made available throughout the day. Outdoor stationary equipment is safely surrounded by protective surfacing of the appropriate depth.
