<p>General Comments</p> <p>Renewal inspection completed today. Children were observed in the indoor and outdoor play environments. In the outdoor play environment, children engaged in play on the play equipment, with basketballs and football, drawing at the picnic table and playing in the sandbox.</p> <p>The indoor environment is purposefully planned with a variety of materials that are easily accessible for children. Children moved freely throughout the indoor play environment engaging in dramatic play, creative art, blocks, games and gross motor activities in the gym.</p> <p>The educator uses a planning notebook to document activities and materials as well as posting documentation on social media for parents. As discussed, documentation should be posted in the environment as well to allow children to revisit and expand their interests as well as creating a sense of belonging.</p> <p>During snack, the educator was observed to sit alongside children and engage in conversation.</p>
