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<p><b>General Comments</b></p> <p>Upon arrival, the 2's and 3's were entering the outdoor play space. I entered the facility to inform the Operator that I had arrived. The 4 year olds were engaged in play but soon cleaned up, washed their hands and settled for snack. I walked throughout the facility and noted that each classroom was very well organized with an abundance of materials, set up on easily accessible shelves for the children. The learning centres were clearly defined and had enough space for the children to move freely and explore. The pretend woodstoves in the rooms created a calm and cozy atmosphere. It was also observed that bins were labelled with pictures and books were placed in areas other than a reading corner. For example, in one classroom there were books on the sensory bin.</p> <p>The children's learning and documentation was posted throughout the classroom and on doors. This consisted of the children's artwork sometimes labelled with their personal pictures, framed learning stories or artwork, question charts about the children's mom's for mother's day, and clipboards with the children's attached artwork displayed on the wall. The children's quoted words were also visible on specific documentation. A group project for Earth Day, pictures of community business, and the children's family photos were also visible in the classrooms.</p> <p>The Operator stated that she is in process of adding materials to the outdoor play space. Even though, she is preparing for the nicer weather, the outdoor play space is an extension of their indoor play space and you could easily identify the different learning centres available to the children. This included but not limited to a garden, a cozy area, a gross motor area with a slide structure, ride on toys, trucks and cars, a mud kitchen, balls, and lego.</p> <p>The interactions between the educators and the children were positive on the day of my visit. The educators were continuously engaged at the children's level. I observed a circle time where a book was being read to the children and the educator gave the children the opportunity to ask and answer many questions. The educator made the experience interesting and kept the children's attention for the duration. The educators also recognized the different needs of the children. There was a child who had arrived and was upset because their parent had left. The educators and the inclusion support worker approached the child in a calm and reassuring</p>

way. Lights were dimmed which provided a more peaceful environment allowing the child to eventually be more calm.

Children's and Staff files were organized and easily verified by licensing staff. I can now recommend for licensing pending a current Public Health inspection.
