<p>General Comments</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Morning visit to the establishment for an unexpected monitoring inspection -Ratio was respected during the visit -The administrator as well as all educators have a valid first aid certificate -The administrator and more than 50% of the staff have their one-year Early childhood education certificate -Medications are locked and inaccessible to children, administration of medication records are evident. -Medication used for anaphylactic shock (EPIPEN) are stored safely (inaccessible to children) but easy to access for staff -During the visit, it was observed that all educators are engaged with children at their level providing support and having conversations. Open-end questions are asked and guidance is given in a respectful and kind way -Each child has an easily accessible space to store their personal belongings, which is labeled with their name and used only for the intended child. -A first-aid kit and a phone are always accessible on site and on outings. -A lifeguard is on duty when accessing a public pool or public swimming area -Outdoor play area is maintained safe and free of hazards -Infant outdoor play area is separate from preschool children -In the outdoor play area children have more than one type of surfacing to play and explore, the material offered is varied and in sufficient quantity for children present -The outdoor play area has at least 0.45m² of shade for each child based on the maximum number of children that can be accommodated in the outdoor play area -In all rooms, evidence of purposeful planning based on children's interest and learning, webbing, invitation, photos and learning stories were <p>Observations: When arriving at the center children were finishing up their snack, they all got ready and went outside to play. Extra stations were added into the preschool playground, a magic potion station and a reading station. Infants were very involved in a sensory bin, sand box and playing with balls. All groups came in during the visit, washed their hands and got ready for lunch.</p>
