A Monitoring Inspection was completed this afternoon.

The preschoolers were observed in their classroom, during free play. Children were observed sitting at a long

table, playing with Play Doh and Play Doh accessories. An educator was observed reading to the children, while the children created their Play Doh creations. Several well-defined learning / play areas were observed within the preschool classroom - dramatic play, building, arts & crafts, and a reading area. Two sensory tables were observed, one with rocks and toy vehicles, and the other with colored rice and plastic dishes. Several forms of documentation were observed - children's photos, children's artwork, and individual binders with children's artwork. A conversation was had regarding the outdated framed artwork. Administrator stated that the pictures within these frames would be updated.

School Aged Rooms - The 2 afterschool rooms were observed. One room had dolls, doll accessories, a puzzle, Little People and house, paper and mark making materials, and books. The other room had a large container of Lego, Chess, and books. As for materials, this is a good start, but more materials are required. When adding materials and activities to the school-age classrooms, ensure to include the items that are listed on pages 157 - 173 of the Operator's Manual – Appendix 24 – Equipment and Materials for School-age Children. School-aged play areas should minimally include the following: An art and creative area, science and nature area, a block and construction area, dramatic play and housekeeping area, a quiet reading area, fine motor / manipulative area for scientific and mathematical investigation and measurement, space and equipment for large motor play, sand and water play, and music and movement.

It is recommended that the children be split by ages (K-2 in one room and 3-5 in the other room). A further discussion will be had with administrators regarding today's groupings.
