General Comments							
A renewal inspection occurred today.							
The pre-school children were observed playing with magnetic blocks, play food, and coloring. The educators were observed reading stories with the children and offering assistance when needed. The children were observed playing on the stationary equipment outside, playing with a parachute, and blowing bubbles.							
The school-age children were observed outside playing on the stationary equipment, digging in the dirt, playing catch, and soccer.							
The following records were reviewed: Incident logs, fire drills, medication records, and daily attendance sheets.							
All staff and child files were viewed.							
<ul> <li>Licensing staff discussed the following with the administrator:</li> <li>Creating a documentation binder to highlight the school-aged children's play/learning experiences. The binder should be kept in a prominent place where parents/guardians can easily access to see what their children have been experiencing.</li> <li>Purchasing carts to store play materials on so they are easily accessible for the school-age children.</li> <li>Ensuring that the school-age classrooms are set up with learning interest centers and age-appropriate materials.</li> </ul>
