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General Comments
Monitoring Inspection Upon arrival the children were transitioning from the outdoors to indoors for lunch. After lunch the children were observed using baby dolls and newly added accessories such as a stroller and carrier and reading books with their educator. The educators indicated that the children are currently interested in baby dolls, puzzles, water play and cutting activities. Positive child guidance techniques were observed. The educators were seen engaging at the children's level, providing appropriate supervision, using encouraging language, offering choices, and assisting children with decision-making. A clearly visible and prominent area was designated for the posting of the facility license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documentation reviewed included incident logs, daily attendance records, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills. A conversation took place with the administrator on the following: • There was no evidence of purposeful planning, and no current documentation was observed in the classroom. Purposeful planning and documentation are required and must be present, reflecting the children's ongoing learning. • The outdoor wooden structures have areas of rotting and splintering wood. The administrator stated that these structures were recently installed and that photographs have been sent to the company. Licensing advised that the rotting and splintering wood must be repaired or replaced to ensure the structures remain safe for use by children.
