General Comments					

Upon licensing staff's arrival, Group A was preparing to go outside, and Group B was finishing up their games inside the gym.

Transitions ran smoothly, and children were aware of expectations/routine. While waiting for children to finish changing their shoes, the Group A educator played a transition game with the children of "higher or lower."

Educators were quick to recognize if children needed assistance or guidance. When one child appeared red in the face and hot after playing basketball in the gym, the program manager asked if he would like to get a drink and wet down his face a bit before getting his outdoor shoes on. When one child started eating some snack while getting her shoes on, the program manager suggested to her to take her snack outside.

Stocked backpacks, name tags and walkie talkies remained with the educators outdoors. Sight lines were wellmaintained, and educators spread out throughout the playground and engaged with the children in their play. Educators took ample time to listen to children's thoughts and ideas. They played along with the children's imaginative play and showed genuine interest. If disagreements or big feelings arose, educators spoke in a calm, compassionate tone at the children's level.

When returning indoors, children had snack. The tables were disinfected and prepared with a piece of paper towel for each child's snack. A daily special helper got to help pass out snack. The posted menu reflects substitutions given. Snack today was oranges, apples, pretzels, wow butter and water. Educators continued to engage with children during snack- they read a book and sat with the children.

After snack, children had children's choice time and various stations were set up with drawing, coloring, art journals, Lego and bracelet making. Some children also liked sitting with their friends and talking.

Staff, child files, and other documents and checklists were easily verified and are complete.
