Comments: When inspector arrived on site an infant (23 months) was in the preschool classroom. The infant was transitioning in this new group and had been added to the COVID-19 group log. As stated in the regulation 10(7) Children under the age of 24 months are not mixed with other ages. An infant transitioning to a preschool room can only be done once the infant turns 2. Inspector discussed with the director about creating a transition plan to be put into place after the infant has his birthday. During the inspection the infant and an educator were moved back to the infant group and added to the group log. Deficiency is now compliant

Comments: Regulation 39(2)(a) - Toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies are locked and inaccessible to children. The toxic products under the counter in the kitchen and washrooms were secured with a child safety lock but must be locked with key.			

General Comments

During the renewal inspections the inspector was fully screened by the director before entering the daycare. Proper screening documents are being used and cleaning schedules have been created and are being used. Inspector recommends that the staff add their initials once a task is complete to ensure they are all being done and changing the word sanitizer to disinfect when applicable. Inspector discussed with the staff on site about the COVID recovery phase and how they are ensuring the safety of themselves and the children onsite.

In order to facility the identification of each classroom during inspections a recommendation was made too label the classrooms. Director on site has named the classrooms by letters from A to E.

When doing outings or excursions the center must create specific consent forms as stated on page 44 of the Operator Manual for Part -time and Full-time Early Learning and Childcare centers. When outings resume before an outing occurs the parents must sign consent forms.

Inspector and director discussed futur plans of renovations and how they will ensure the children's safety during construction time.

General Comments

During time of inspection the inspector observed positive interactions between the educators and children, good health procedure while preparing the food, Healthy snacks and lunch was provided to the children.
