Comments: The inspector reviewed 12 children's files and observed that one file is missing the child's Medicare number. All children's files must include the child's name, address, date of birth, and Medicare number. The inspector has a discussion with the administrator regarding all children's files must be reviewed to ensure that they are all completed with no information missing from them. The administrator received the missing Medicare number from the parent before the inspector left the facility. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: Upon the inspector's arrival in one classroom, the educator informed the inspector that 21 children are present. The inspector counted 21 children; however, the daily attendance record indicated that only 19 children are present. The daily attendance records must be completed each time a child arrives and leaves and must accurately reflect all children present at any given time. The inspector discussed this with the educator, who then recorded the arrival times of the two children who had not been signed in on the daily attendance record. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: The inspector observed that only the half-day daily routine is posted, while the full-day daily routine is not. The daily routine must be displayed in a visible and prominent location within the facility. The inspector informed the administrator who printed and posted the full-day daily routine on the facility's posting board. Deficiency is now compliant.			

General Comments
The inspector is on site to conduct the renewal inspection.
During the inspection, the inspector observed the morning snack period and children transitioning to an outing at Centennial Park by walking. The inspector also verified that all required parental consent forms authorizing children to participate in the outing had been signed.

General Comments

In addition, the inspector observed indoor free play, the lunch period, the rest period, and children engaged in a variety of activities, including playing soccer and participating in arts and crafts.

A discussion is held with the educators and the administrator regarding the requirement that all children's personal belongings, including lunch boxes and water bottles, are clearly labelled with the child's name.

Another discussion took place regarding fire drills. The inspector noted that a fire drill had not been conducted during the month of February; however, they were completed during the five months following February. The inspector discussed with the administrator the importance of ensuring that monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills are conducted and properly documented.

A discussion is also held with the administrator to clarify that eligible educators must complete the required 10 hours of professional development prior to the permit expiry date of August 31, 2026.

The inspector discusses with the educator and administrator rest period practices. Children who are resting on a mat but remain awake should not be required to stay on the mat for longer than 30 minutes.

An additional discussion is held regarding the preschool room during the rest period. It was observed that the room remains dark for children who do not nap. The inspector recommended providing low-level lighting to allow children to move safely within the room and access to toys and activities while ensuring the other children are sleeping.

The ratio is respected throughout the inspection.
