in three classrooms were not up to date. In one classroom, only four children were signed in, while six were present. In another classroom, 13 children were signed in, but 14 were present. Similarly, in the third classroom, only four children were signed in, while six were present. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educators of the importance of maintaining accurate and up-to-date daily attendance records. The educators promptly updated the records to include the missing children. Deficiency is now compliant

Comments: During the monitoring inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that crayons and markers were not accessible to the children. Upon questioning, the educator explained that the materials had been put away to prevent children from drawing on surfaces around the room. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator that arts and craft materials must always be easily accessible to children on low, open shelves. In response, the educator promptly made some art and craft materials available to the children. Deficiency is now compliant

	While assessing the child-to-staff ratio in the three-year-old room, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that only one educator and one inclusion support worker were present for fourteen children. Since most of the children were awake and no longer napping, the required ratio was not being met. When questioned, the educator and inclusion support worker explained that the second educator was on their lunch break. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator and the inclusion support worker, that inclusion support workers are not counted in the child-to-staff ratio and that the ratio can only be reduced to 50% if all children are on their mats and asleep. The Quality Assurance Monitor then reiterated to the administrator that the child-to-staff ratio must always be maintained and can only be reduced during nap time when all children are asleep. In response, the administrator immediately assigned another educator to the room. Deficiency is now compliant
