General Comments
<p>Licensing Staff arrived at Happy Faces Home Childcare to conduct a Monitoring Inspection. Upon arrival, the children were gathered around the Operator reading stories. They read "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" and "Sing in the Spring". Throughout the stories the Operator stopped several times, asking the children engaged questions and letting them ask questions. After story time the children washed their hands and transitioned upstairs to the kitchen for morning snack. Today the children had waffles, bananas and milk, which matched what was posted on the menu. The children were observed washing hands before and after morning snack.</p> <p>Once all the children had finished eating, the Operator sanitized the table and set out materials for craft time. The children were observed practicing cutting with scissors, cutting out a variety of shapes. Later, the children painted a spring animal. The children were observed painting birds, butterflies and ladybugs. The Operator let the children choose as many paint colors as they wanted from a large bin. Once the children finished their craft they went to the washroom and prepared to go outside. The Operator encouraged their independence as they got snowpants, jackets, hats, mittens and boots on, offering assistance when needed.</p> <p>The transition outside was smooth. The children were eager to play on the Teeter Totter and swing set. While playing outside the children were observed making cakes in a play kitchen area and climbing a small play structure and using the slide. Some of the older children enjoyed pushing their younger peers on the swings and playing peek-a-boo. A gentle reminder was heard before the group cleaned up and got ready to go inside for lunch time.</p> <p>Once back inside, the children removed their outdoor gear, got indoor shoes on and washed their hands for lunch. Only positive child guidance was observed during today's Monitoring Inspection. The Operator was patience, kind and nurturing towards the children. Praise and words of encouragement were heard throughout the morning. The indoor environment was welcoming, tidy and bright. Several Spring themed activities were observed in the classroom such as a colorful spring sensory bin with flowers, pasta and cups.</p>
