Comments: Group 1 and Group 2: Dramatic play materials depleted. Examples of items to add, but not limited to: costumes, hats, scarves, purses, office supplies, restaurant items, clipboards, cash register, money, pretend food, real life items, loose parts, tools, items that support the children's interests.  Group 2 (right side): Art materials depleted. A variety of open ended creative art materials must be accessible to the children. Examples of materials to include, but are not limited to: a variety of paper (plain white, colours, textures and sizes), collage materials, glue sticks, mark making materials, loose parts, paint, paint brushes, chalk, etc.

Comments: Group 2 (right side): Materials and toys stored in closed storage cabinets. Materials and toys must be displayed and stored on low, open shelving that allows children the opportunity for free choice of activities.

Comments: Group 1 (left side): Dramatic play materials, books and art materials cluttered and unorganized. To be decluttered and organized in a way that is inviting and engaging for the children.

Comments: Shaving cream unlocked in two cabinets in the school age room. Shaving cream must be locked when not in use.			

## General Comments

Monitoring Inspection:  
March Break Day Camp.

Educators and children engaged in a variety of activities this morning including Perler Beads, Lego, gym activities and sensory play. Many positive interactions were observed today between the educators and children.

Hand washing routines were observed.

Educators seem eager to improve their program and environments. They asked many questions about environments, materials, purposeful planning and room layout during monitoring inspection today.

Discussed adding gross motor area to the environment as this seems to be an interest for some of the children. Examples of items that could be included: bean bag toss, small weights, gym mat, long jump, hula hoops, exercise ball, small balance beam, etc.

Discussed with the educator the importance of low open shelving and displaying materials, books and equipment in an inviting way for the children.

Discussed creating a safe space for the children to tinker with tools and materials that can be taken apart and put back together. How could you engage the children in this type of exploration? What materials can you add?

Next steps:

Creating a more age appropriate dramatic play area. Adding real life materials and experiences to this area will engage school-age children in dramatic play.

Displaying books throughout the environments, to promote literacy.

Adding challenges to engage the children (STEM, gross motor, board games or card games).

Adding an easel for painting opportunities.
