Comments: During seated circle time, some children were observed leaving the group repeatedly to engage in alternative activities. In response, an educator stated they would "call the parents" when a child was not listening and later informed the child they would "be last to be chosen" during the transition to pre-planned activities. Educators must use positive guidance strategies and respond to children's cues and needs. Recommendations include pausing or adapting circle time to better suit the group, such as incorporating movement-based options like outdoor play, action songs, or movement games.			

General Comments
<p>Upon licensing staff arrival, children were engaged in free play using a variety of indoor materials. Activities observed included playing with cars, engaging in dramatic play, and playing with dolls. Some children also participated in a scavenger hunt. Educators had prepared a printed sheet featuring Arctic animals and hid corresponding plastic animals throughout the space for the children to find.</p> <p>Approximately 10 minutes prior to cleanup time, educators provided the group with a reminder. After cleanup, the group transitioned to snack. Children washed their hands, and tables were cleaned before and after eating.</p> <p>Following snack, each child completed a daily notebook drawing. Children were encouraged to draw freely in their individual binders, which are kept as personal keepsakes. Some children also practiced writing their names.</p> <p>The group then transitioned to circle time. During this time, children played a game of "I Spy," sang literacy-based songs such as "Days of the Week" and songs about the month, and discussed the current date. Educators also facilitated a literacy activity focused on a "letter of the day," where children identified the letter on a large board and shared words that begin with that letter. A book about Arctic animals was also read, supporting the theme of the week.</p> <p>While circle time was occurring, one educator prepared invitations to play related to the Arctic animal theme,</p>

which aligned with the week's theme and children's interests. These activities included exploring plastic animals and recreating them using playdough, completing a puzzle using paper and shapes, and measuring life-sized taped animal paw prints on the floor with educator support. Following this, a game of musical chairs was facilitated. As this is a half-day program, children were picked up by their parents at noon.

Throughout the morning visit, evidence of curriculum implementation was observed. Children had individual binders containing documentation of child-led activities, and there was clear evidence of thoughtful pre-planning. One recent highlighted activity included a visit from community firefighters and rescue trucks. Following the visit, children created thank-you paintings for the essential workers. Connections to the local community were also evident within the environment, as posters of local stores were displayed on the walls.

The after-school group arrived from the school bus at approximately 3:00 p.m. Upon entering the daycare, the children put their belongings away and transitioned into free play. A variety of indoor materials were available, and children were observed engaging in activities such as building with Lego, drawing, completing puzzles, creating forts, and playing with dolls. Some children also participated in a small-group activity with an educator, measuring how many "paper snowflakes tall" they were.

Staff and child files were verified. Monthly fire drills are completed.

Licensing staff will return for a follow-up inspection.
