Comments: A sufficient quantity of materials and equipment ensures the availability of enough play resources for each age group served, avoiding excessive competition and long waits for children. New items are added regularly

Comments: A daily incident log is required for incidents that do not need emergency medical attention but may require minor first aid (for example, bumps, scrapes, minor cuts and bites). Incident logs are to be filed chronologically by date in a folder or binder so that ELC licensing staff can easily access the information.

General Comments								

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on October 3, 2024.

Children were observed during their transition to the center, engaging in both indoor and outdoor free play.

General Comments

Educators were seen interacting with the children, asking thoughtful questions and expanding on the ideas presented by the children. They also incorporated their own interests into their documentation, creating a personalized and engaging learning environment.

The facility had a clearly visible and prominent space to post the license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. The room was well-organized and inviting, with materials arranged to encourage children's play. Books chosen to reflect the children's interests were available, and well-defined learning and play areas were observed. Several pieces of the children's artwork were displayed throughout the facility, showcasing creativity. Toxic products, such as chemical cleaners, were safely locked away and inaccessible to children. Drinking water was made available throughout the day, and allergy information for children was posted for staff awareness.

The program provided a variety of opportunities for individual and group experiences, allowing children to express their creativity, explore arts and sciences, experience accomplishments, problem-solve, and develop trusting, respectful, and supportive relationships.

A conversation with the Administrator highlighted both the strengths and areas for improvement within the facility. Strengths included educators extending the curriculum outdoors and making efforts to bring the natural world into the classroom. A variety of unique play activities were evident, and educators were involved in creating imaginative and special projects alongside the children.

However, several needs were identified: educators should circulate during indoor and outdoor play to engage with groups of children, ensuring proper supervision and active participation in play. Documentation and art displays should be regularly updated to reflect recent activities, with the names and dates of educators included. Additionally, more outdoor materials should be added to ensure all children have the opportunity to participate in diverse play activities.
