## **General Comments**

Name of operator

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on December 4, 2024.

During the visit, children engaged in both indoor and outdoor free play, as well as snack time. Proper handwashing practices were followed during the transition to snack, ensuring hygiene standards were maintained. Educators shared that the children are currently interested in activities such as outdoor basketball, building with Lego, and finger painting using loose parts. Positive language and gentle reminders were observed in educator-child interactions, and educators actively participated in outdoor play with the children.

The facility demonstrated compliance with safety and operational protocols. A daily incident log is maintained, and parents are informed of incidents through report forms as needed. Parents of enrolled children are granted access to the center at any time. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and documented, with evacuation procedures prominently displayed. Licensing documents, inspection reports, and compliance orders are posted in a visible location. Additionally, the facility posts the daily routine and life-threatening allergy information for staff awareness.

The environment supports learning and exploration, with well-defined play and learning areas and children's artwork displayed throughout the facility. Selected books reflect the children's interests, and traffic and outdoor areas are kept clean and free of hazards. Opportunities for individual and group experiences are integrated alongside literacy activities and creative exploration. Children have chances to engage in the arts, sciences, problem-solving, and relationship-building, fostering a trusting and supportive environment.
