General Comments					

A Monitoring Inspection occurred this February 4, 2025.

Children were observed engaging in play, demonstrating cooperation and creativity in their interactions. Proper handwashing was observed during the transition to snack. Educators noted that children are currently very interested in making valentines for friends and family, creating origami, building Beyblades from LEGO, and setting up a market center with educators. They also enjoy playing group games outside. Educators engage with children by asking questions and expanding on their ideas, fostering meaningful discussions and encouraging creativity.

The facility's new fence is in excellent condition. A daily incident log is maintained, and parents are informed of any incidents, with incident report forms completed for reportable events. Parents of children present at the center are granted entry at any time. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and posted. The facility has a clearly visible location for posting the license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. The daily routine is posted in each room, along with evacuation procedures in a prominent location. Life-threatening allergies are documented and displayed as required.

The facility is well-equipped with a variety of age-appropriate materials, books, and toys. A sensory area is available in sufficient quantity for play. Traffic areas and outdoor walkways are kept clean and free of clutter. Toxic products, such as chemical cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day to ensure hydration.

The curriculum provides opportunities for both individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are incorporated into the indoor environment, supporting children's language and cognitive development.
