General Comments

Upon Licensing staff arrival, the children were going outdoors to play. Educators were observed walking with the children together until entering the fenced in play space. The first aid kit as well as attendance sheet was taken outdoors and hung up on the fence. Children were observed playing with small buckets, shovels, cars, balls, a tea set, Little Tikes playhouse, a slide and a Cozy Coupe car. Educators were engaged in conversation with the children and were observed sitting with them scooping in the rocks and helping them go down the slide. Kind words of encouragement were heard such as "good job!" and "ready, set go!" Educators were heard asking the children about the colours on the toys and asking them questions on what they would like to play with. There is evidence of daily routine as the children helped tidy up their toys before returning indoors to prepare for lunch.

Once indoors, personal belongings were hung up in the main entry way and the children took turns having their hands washed and diapers checked or changed. While waiting for hand washing and diapers to be completed, Educators sang songs with the children such as Twinkle Twinkle Little Star and the ABC's. The children sang along to each song as were excited to shout "hooray!" at the end of If You're Happy and you Know It. For lunch, some of the children sat together at a small table while a few others sat in highchairs nearby. Educators assisted the children when needed with eating and were observed offering gentle reminders to keep their food in their own space. After lunch, children's hands and faces were washed and the nap room was prepared. Nap cots and playpens were spaced accordingly and again, there was evidence of a daily routine as the children went to sleep easily. An Educator remained in the room during nap time and soothing white noise was played.

During nap time, an Educator was observed cleaning the main room. The floors were swept, tables were wiped down, the bathroom was cleaned, and laundry was washed. The main room was organized, inviting and bright. Play material was tidy and easily accessible to the children. Bins of toys such as wooden blocks, balls, cars, dinosaurs, and musical instruments were labelled and in good condition. In the cozy reading corner, there were family pictures on the wall, a mirror, a soft area rug, a rocking chair for stories, dolls and accessories as well as a small couch and chair. Children's artwork and current learning stories were on display throughout the main room as well as in the entry way.

Staff and child files were verified, and all required documentation was present. Monthly fire drills and playground maintenance checks are being completed and logged. The parent board contained all required documentation
