General Comments
<p>A Monitoring Inspection occurred on February 25, 2025.</p> <p>Children were observed engaging in both indoor and outdoor free play. Educators noted that the children are currently showing a strong interest in winter activities, painting with cars and trucks, making dinosaur fossils, and creating string art. Additionally, educators have included themselves and their personal interests within their documentation.</p> <p>The facility maintains a daily incident log. Outdoor play is provided for at least one hour within each four-hour block when the majority of children are present, weather permitting. Monthly emergency evacuations are conducted and posted accordingly. The license, current inspection report, monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance are displayed in a clearly visible and prominent location. A daily routine is posted in each room.</p> <p>Evacuation procedures are prominently posted. Information about life-threatening allergies and notices regarding communicable diseases are clearly displayed. The facility has selected books that reflect the children's interests. Children's art is displayed at eye level, with the child's name and date included. A varied supply of appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys is available.</p> <p>Toxic products, including chemical cleaners, are securely locked and inaccessible to children. The changing area is located within one meter of a sink, and diaper-changing procedures are posted and visible to staff performing diaper changes. Drinking water is made available throughout the day, and infant bottles are clearly labeled for each child. The infant outdoor play area is either separate or used at different times than other groups of children.</p> <p>Opportunities are provided for both individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are present in</p>

the indoor environment. Portfolios are actively being completed with the children, who also have access to their own portfolios.

A conversation occurred with the Operator and Administrator regarding the facility's strengths and areas for improvement. Identified strengths included creative interest centers, effective webbing of the children's interests, and clean environments. Areas for improvement discussed included notifying the QAM in the event of an outbreak using a reportable incident form, updates to the parent and staff handbooks, and considerations regarding the ISP program. Additionally, it is expected that the facility will relocate to the new building before the next renewal.
